# Open Call for Artists

### REIMAGINE THE WORLD WITH US! Sept 2021



The World Reimagined, a national art education project featuring globallyrecognised artists, launches its Open Call for Artists to transform how we understand the Transatlantic Slave Trade and its impact on us all.

#### This is a creative opportunity for artists working in the mediums of paint, photography, drawing, mosaic, sculpture and collage.

The World Reimagined will see trails of large Globe sculptures in cities across the UK, from August to October 2022, created by artists to bring to life the reality and impact of the Transatlantic Slave Trade. The trails will be the centre of a broader learning and engagement programme — engaging more than one million visitors across the country.

The World Reimagined, at its core, is built on our belief in the transformative power of art: to inspire, to move and to open our imagination to new possibilities. The artists who create the Globe sculptures that form our trails are essential in helping people travel through this <u>Journey of Discovery</u>.

We are thrilled that some of the world's bestloved artists are creating designs for The World Reimagined. We hope that artists from all over the UK will take part in our Open Call to have their work featured in our trails.

The blank Globe Sculpture that will be the canvas for all participating artists was conceived by Founding Artist Yinka Shonibare CBE. Shonibare also, vitally, conceived and created 'The World Reimagined' — the first Globe sculpture that will be featured in the trails — after which the whole project of The World Reimagined has been named.

Artists are asked to submit designs that they can apply to the Globes in response to the nine themes of The World Reimagined's Journey of Discovery (see our website).

Submitted designs will be considered by the Open Call Jury.

# A NATIONAL ART EDUCATION PROJECT ON AN UNPRECEDENTED SCALE

The World Reimagined will see trails of large Globe Sculptures in cities across the UK from August to October 2022, created by artists to bring to life the reality and impact of the Transatlantic Slave Trade responding to themes ranging from 'Mother Africa' and 'The Reality of Being Enslaved' to 'Still We Rise' and 'Expanding Soul'. The Globes will be created by both established and undiscovered artists, alongside unique collaborations which bring together national and international icons and communities with artists. The trails will be the centre of a broader education and engagement programme-with hundreds of schools, community groups, sporting and cultural institutions taking part-that will deliver significant, proven community benefit as well as economic and visitor uplift for participating cities.



The World Reimagined is a vibrant project that will inspire and instil pride in what it means to be Black and British and help us all better understand what it means to be British. We invite you to join us to help our society come together in dialogue, re-examine our understanding of our history and reimagine the world that we can create together – one rooted in acknowledgement, dignity and unity, cherishing our diversity.

## With trails live August to October 2022, The World Reimagined will:

- See 100+ large Globe Sculptures in 8 cities across the UK
- Actively engage one million+ visitors with the trails
- Secure the participation of 250+ schools, meaningfully engaging 25,000+ students in The World Reimagined learning programme, including the delivery of a Leadership in Teaching programme to teachers from each school
- Raise awareness of The World Reimagined and its subject with 15+ million people across the UK.
